The GMA team have been busy, working towards getting the project moving.



## Flagship Trials

Work is now underway on all three flagship trials. For the Growing Minds Check In Flagship Trial (online screening and triage tool; led by the University of Sydney), the Advisory Group recently made a decision to change the design of this trial to a waitlist control trial. The GMCI trial manager Jaimie Northam has recently gone on maternity leave and has been replaced by Dr Talia Carl. Talia is an early-career researcher with extensive research experience

## **Clinical Trials Network**

The Clinical Trials Network
workshops have now been
completed. Researchers from
around the country came together
to make some important decisions
about the core goals and
sustainability of the Clicianal Trials
Network including:

- Calling for tenders to run

   an iterative prioritization
   process using Delphi, 1000
   Minds and surveys to
   develop CYMH research
   priorities spanning specific
   research questions, types
   of trials, and infrastructure
   needed
- Moving funding from direct trial support to sustainable

#### **OTHER NEWS**

GMA has joined with several other MH national networks including MAGNET, APECC, ALIVE Translation Network, Inside Out, to ensure we are not duplicating efforts and maximizing efficiency. For example, our Health Economics group works across several of these networks and so it would be hugely advantageous for us to set up infrastructure that serves all MH groups.

# **GMA IMPACT**

GMA IMPACT is now in development with an advisory committee established, several demonstration clinics recruited, and seed funding from GMA and the WA government, to test 3 pillars of innovation for CYMH services: Immediate engagement
