# The Growing Minds Check-In is now available!

Dr Jaimie Northam and team are excited to announce the launch of the Growing Minds Check-In for Parents study is now live! The Growing Minds Check-In is GMAs first flagship trial and has been designed to be a mental health and wellbeing check-in tool for parents of children 0 - 17 years. The Check-In is short and combines subjective reports of mental health and wellbeing concerns with some established measures of child development and wellbeing. Participants receive feedback about their concerns and how their child compares to others of a similar age, in age relevant domains of wellbeing. Recommendations are then provided for free or low-cost programs and information that are available for immediate access online. This tool has been three years in the making and is a true GMA collaborative effort. We are very proud and hope you like it.

The Check-In is currently only available to the public via the research study. We're hoping to reach our study target numbers quickly, so we are able to use the results to enhance the tool and then make it freely available.

We would greatly appreciate you sharing the Growing Minds Check-In study with your networks. We are excited to keep you informed about the results.

Endorsement by GMA signals to funders that the application has already undergone a peer review to ensure that it (1) is aligned with the values and priorities of the CTN (in GMA this means it addresses questions of key importance to child and youth mental health stakeholders in Australia); and (2) incorporates appropriate plans for what we refer to as the GMA core methods for trial development and implementation, including stakeholder consultation (e.g., lived experience; co-design), a clear statistical analysis plan, a strategy for translation, and health economics (along with appropriate budgeting where relevant).
